PROGRAM RESOURCES

All newly admitted students to the PhD program in Educational Policy Studies receive funding package, typically five academic years, from a combination of school or university fellowships, teaching assistantships, and/or project/research assistantships. Details on specific funding packages will be provided at the time of admission. Assistantships and fellowships generally include tuition remission, access to health insurance and other benefits, and a competitive living stipend. Please note that funding is contingent on satisfactory academic progress, satisfactory performance of assigned work duties, and the availability of resources.
