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The following opportunities can help students connect with other students interested in biology, build relationships with faculty and staff, and contribute to out-of-classroom learning:

- Many Study Abroad programs offer a plethora of excellent upper-level bioscience courses. Students often complete courses abroad that meet upper-level breadth in the major requirements (categories A to E) while others use this opportunity to focus on nonscience coursework and explore other topics that interest them. - Students are encouraged to get involved in research in any life-science department. Research can be performed for either course credit or pay, depending on the opportunity.
